Scholarship Name

The IASAS Roger B. Ludeman Scholarship for global Student Affairs and Services professional development.

Purpose

To honor the lifelong commitment of Dr. Roger B. Ludeman, IASAS Emeritus President, by supporting the professional development of IASAS members who demonstrate financial need and a strong commitment to advancing Student Affairs and Services worldwide.

Each year, approximately twenty €500 scholarships will be awarded to expand equitable access to global professional development opportunities and to continue Roger's legacy of building a connected, compassionate, and international Student Affairs and Services community.

Target Group

IASAS members early to mid-career professionals, practitioners, and emerging leaders in Student Affairs and Services, who require financial support to pursue professional development activities offered by the association.

Roger stayed connected over time and drove many of the activities and events of the association. To advance the field evenly these scholarships can assist in the overall development of the global field of student affairs and services, ensuring voices from around the world. Scholarship can be used for the following: IASAS Certificate Programme - Leadership in Student Affairs and Services / Global Summit / SLGS (staff to accompany students) / In person Association Meeting / Research (TBD in the future).

Application Form

To apply you are asked to share your professional background, Proposed Professional Development Activity, motivation, impact statement, and financial need. When applying you are confirming that you will share a post-activity reflection and acceptant to your name and basic contact information may be shared on our website.

Gratitude & Scholarship Structure

Total Annual Funding: \$10,000 designated annually by Roger and Sandy Ludeman.

Eligible Criteria

Applicants must:

- Be a current IASAS effective member
- Be early, mid, or senior career professionals
- Show commitment to Student Affairs and Services

- Pursue professional development activities aligned with IASAS work

Selection Criteria

Evaluation based on:

- Commitment to Student Affairs and Services
- Impact of proposed activity
- Leadership/volunteering engagement
- Social inclusion considerations
- Quality of application

Grant Disbursement

- Once accepted grant will be provided
- Short post-activity reflection required

Marketing

- During the first quarter of each year the scholarship will be publicized in the newsletter and on the website
- Highlight recipients on website, social media, and newsletters
- Share an annual report with the Roger's Ludeman's wife, Sandy Ludeman
- Maintain a dedicated page honoring Roger B. Ludeman and the scholarship impact
